Intestate Inheritance Rights for Adopted Persons

Birth Parents in Relation to Adopted Person Citation: Ala Code § 43-8-48 For purposes of intestate succession, an adopted person is the child of an adopting parent and not of the birth parents, except that adoption of a child by the spouse of a birth parent has no effect on the right of the child to inherit from or through either birth parent

Making a Declaration of Guardian for Minor Children in Texas

If both of a child's parents die, the State, through a judge, will decide who takes care of them until they are grown The judge wants to know what the parents think is best for their child A Declaration of Guardian is a formal way for parents to tell a court who they want to take care of their children if they, the parent, are unable to do so

If both parents have custody of a child and one of them dies, the other alone shall have custody If both parents die, the court shall, upon notification by the social welfare committee or when the fact otherwise becomes known, entrust custody to one or two specially appointed custodians
